Dog Owners Please Note:

- One of our villagers very sadly lost her dog to the awful Alabama Rot just before
 Christmas, so just a warning to all doggy owners and walkers. Keep a watchful eye on your pets.
 Wash and check over their paws and legs after these soggy muddy walks.
- Although very rare it is not exactly known what causes it, but most cases occur between November
 and May, and it's often reported in dogs that have been walking in muddy or woodland areas. Dogs
 can recover well if they are treated quickly, and only develop skin symptoms, but the outlook is
 much poorer if they also develop kidney problems.
