So what's on this month?



She can't drink or vote and she's yet to sit her A-Levels. But local teenager, Amelia, can teach you to fly!!



When we first moved here Amelia, our neighbour's daughter was fascinated with flying so would chat away with my husband, Rob, about all sorts of planes with the confidence as of an old flying pilot. As with all young teenagers, she changed hobby's from horse riding to biking but flying was always there in the background, it was just how to go about getting 'off the ground' so to speak! So Mum & Dad thought a gliding lesson for her 13th birthday would sort it for a while, but in reality she hasn't looked back.



Supported by James, her father, who has the joy of taking her to lessons and helping out at the flying club, it took Amelia just 18months to fly solo and do acrobatics! Now 4yrs on, and with wide support from the gliding community and aviation world Amelia is keen to progress which means clocking up those flying hours. So, she can often be found at the local club in Bicester, helping or taking part in events.

Flying solo since she was 14, she is also the UK's youngest gliding instructor, qualified to guide beginners through their first flights. Comments Amelia, 'I'm qualified to fly

everything from a two-seater to a single-seater K8, which feels as light as a crisp packet,' she says. 'Plus, I've flown about 17 different types of aircraft. I just love flying and the joy of doing it and showing people what it's all about. I can't believe I can do this.' Neither can we! What an amazing start to what we think will be an amazing career.

ELECTRICITY SURVEY - FEEDBACK

The number of responses received was zero. One interpretation of this (there are others!) is as follows:

- 1. No-one in Adstock is sufficiently unhappy with their supplier to feel motivated to respond.
- 2. No-one in Adstock is sufficiently happy with their supplier to feel motivated to recommend them to a fellow villager. The Parish Council's village survey in 2016 concluded that Adstock has a strong sense of community. It follows that if anyone is sufficiently happy with their supplier then it is likely they would have come forward to help a fellow villager.

The implication of all this is that Clarion readers are somewhere near the middle point of a linear range of possible responses spanning from happy to unhappy. They are getting along OK, perhaps marginally happy or marginally unhappy but with far more interesting things to occupy their attention.

The conclusion is that it is good to know that no-one in Adstock is unhappy with their supplier. The system is working.



15th March sees our regular coffee morning which is getting very popular now. Do come along. We would love to see you.


